

All who were at our last meeting noticed how nice the newly refinished bar flooring looked. P/C Greg Edwards had it done and our thanks go out to Greg for such a nice contribution to the club. Care should be taken when moving anything across the floor.

Major renovations to the cottage four interior have been completed by Tom and Julie Shier. It includes new framing, sheetrock, painting, windows and more. Some major plumbing work was needed and Ray Mercure completed all the necessary repairs.

Just a reminder to all who use the club house kitchen, all the dishes in the dish drain and dishwasher are

to be removed and put away. Also, the white kitchen refrigerator should be kept available for those renting the club house rooms.

The pool deck is in bad shape and needs to be repaired or replaced. Several solutions have been suggested including covering the boards with indoor-outdoor carpeting, flipping the boards or applying a surface coating. Whatever the solution, these are only temporary fixes as we plan to replace the decking with some sort of composite material which would be long lasting and require little maintenance.

Commodore Hajos has indicated that all the rooms and cottages are rented for the Five Guys event; if you need rooms for guests, reservations will need to be made elsewhere.

Our pool closes at dusk, the darker stage of twilight, so let's say 9 pm. This time is a requirement in the MD Pool operations guidelines. The open and closed sign does not always get flipped at dusk. Another reminder that dogs are to be leashed and picked up after.

CYC Events



Proposed By-Law Change (additions in **bold**, deletions shown as ~~strikeouts~~):

Article VIII

Initiation Fees – Dues – Other Charges – and Assessments

Section 1. The initiation fee for Active membership shall be \$1,000.00 **for applicants aged 30 and older and \$500.00 for those aged 21-29.** ~~and for~~ Associate membership **initiation fee shall be** \$500.00. The Board of Trustees may authorize the membership to conduct annual active membership drives. During such drives, which shall be conducted for a period of time not to exceed three months in any one year, the initiation free for Active membership may be reduced to an amount not less than fifty percent of the initial fee prescribed in the Club's By-Laws for Active members.

Section 2. The annual dues shall be \$1,000.00 for Active **membership aged 30 and older and \$500.00 for those aged 21-29,** \$800.00 for an Associate membership and \$250.00 for Non-resident members, to be billed quarterly. Any member who has paid dues as an Active or Associate Member for a continuous period of twenty-five years shall be hereafter be

designated a Life Member and exempt from further payment of dues. The term Life Member is not intended as a classification of membership but only indicates that an Active or Associate Member is exempt from paying dues. The annual service fee for Life Members shall be \$250.00 to be billed quarterly. Addition Life memberships shall not be granted after October, 2009. Existing Life Members as of October 1, 2009 shall be grandfathered.

Hello Corinthians. We had a wonderful send off for our 110th voyage which will culminate at the annual oyster fest November 9th, 2013. We are getting started with planning and need your input either for ideas or for offers to do stuff. We are trying to keep the membership from having to do heavy lifting during the day so that all can enjoy the event.

The purpose of the event will be to celebrate our 110th anniversary and to promote Corinthian to potential new members and the community. The event agenda will follow our traditional format with oysters and BBQ during the afternoon followed by dinner and dancing in the evening. We will have entertainment at both venues....Chuck Pearson will have his full band in the evening. We plan to keep the price to about \$50 per person for the full day.

We would like to invite members of our various communities to participate with us. We are considering the elected federal, state and local politicians who represent us, service agencies such as Fire and Rescue, Yacht Clubs and Yacht Club Associations, local Coast Guard and Navy and local educational and religious institutions that we support. We would also like to extend invitations to local businesses we frequent and the Chamber of Commerce.

The first thing we need help with is creating the invitation list. Please send me name, organization, position, and contact information of those you want to be invited. I believe it would be best to have separate invitations for the day and evening events at a price of \$25 per person for each. So indicate which part of the day you recommend they be invited for and if you are willing to sponsor (pay for) their attendance since we do not plan to charge our invited guests. We will be sending written invitations and we would appreciate your personal engagement following up with those you have suggested.

A second area we will need help is planning and supervising set up of our outside venues. We plan to contract for an exterior bathroom trailer, tent and catering services. We need advice first on where these activities are best accommodated...also will need advice on power and water considerations.

So let me know what you think and what you are willing to do....we will discuss in more detail at our next membership meeting.
